* Strollers are not permitted in the main building on Leisurely Art Appreciation Days.

These times are dedicated to allowing families with babies to enjoy the exhibitions without concern. During Baby Hours, strollers are permitted in the main building, where they are normally not allowed.

Why all can feel welcome on G(ALL)ERY Days

- 1 Spacious and relaxed environment** The number of visitors admitted is limited, so exhibitions can be experienced in a more relaxed atmosphere.
- 2 Easy access** Ramps are installed at steps. Wheelchair users and visitors with strollers can move through the museum comfortably.
- 3 Support staff** Staff members are available to assist visitors who may need help using the facilities or viewing the exhibitions.

Information For Visitors Planning to Attend on a G(ALL)ERY Day

Online exhibition tickets must be purchased in advance.

The museum operates on a timed-entry system.

As admission is limited compared to regular days, we encourage you to purchase your ticket early.

Please note that discounts are not available for online ticket purchases.

If you wish to receive a discount, please purchase a same-day ticket at the Box Office.

However, same-day tickets are limited and may sell out before your visit.

Visitors eligible for free admission do not need to purchase an online ticket.

Visitors eligible for free admission:

- Holders of a Shintai Shogaisha Techo (certificate of physical disability), Ai no Techo or Ryoiku Techo (certificate of intellectual disability), Seishin Shogaisha Hoken Fukushi Techo (certificate of mental disability), or Hibakusha Kenko Techo (atomic bomb survivor's health handbook), along with up to 2 caregivers (MIRAIO ID accepted)
- Middle school students and younger
- Holders of invitation tickets, invitation envelopes, or annual passports

Please note that on G(ALL)ERY Days, many visitors will be using wheelchairs or strollers. Tours that involve conversation will also take place, and the atmosphere may differ from regular museum days.

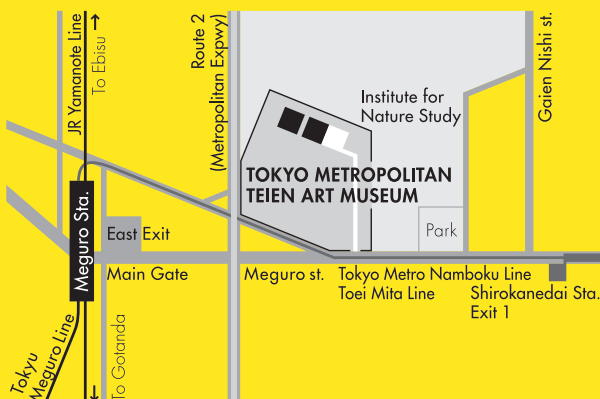
From
